The word Thisri, Tisri, Thisrei, Tisri, Thisrei, Tisri, The Book of Forms and Traditions inform us the significance and origin of this Feast in dedication to King Solomon Temple; the celebration of harvesting and the travelling of the children of Israel in the wilderness for 40 years. Finally, The Small by Mighty Valley of Burlingame will celebrate the Feast of Tishri as has been done for our predecessor by the Chapter of The Consistory under the Leadership of The Lodge of Perfection.
