What's up with the PR?

Over the last few months, I've been asked many times about the lack of a Personal Representative (PR) in our Valley, when will we be getting one and why don't we have one yet. All of which are very reasonable questions, and I should have shared some details many months back.

Most importantly, according to the Statutes of the Supreme Council the position of PR is purely optional. For Valleys where a PR has been appointed, the responsibility for operation of the Valley is shared equally between the PR, General Secretary and Treasurer, with none being higher in rank than the others. In Valleys that don't have a PR (like us), the Valley responsibilities are shared between the General Secretary and Treasurer alone.

Another important item to note is that similar to the Masonic Lodge, the business of the Scottish Rite is conducted by the Venerable Master. Another interesting parallel between the Masonic Lodge and the Scottish Rite is the existence of Inspectors. Oh yes, the Scottish Rite has Inspectors, but we call them Personal Representatives. Just as the Inspector of a Masonic Lodge reports to the Grand Master, the PR reports to the SGIG or Deputy of the Supreme Council, as the case may be.

In addition to the who/when/why questions, another concern I hear is that the lack of a PR somehow gives a negative image of the health of our Valley. With this concern in mind, Ill.: Jones spoke with Ill.: Loui and was informed that there are no plans to merge or otherwise close the Valley of Burlingame. Ill.: Loui did mention, however, that the smaller Valleys throughout the state are under observation.

What does that last statement mean for us? It means that we need our members to attend our Stated Meetings. It means that we need our members to be present at and participate in our degrees. It means that each one of us must renew our commitment to the Valley of Burlingame and be present, involved, excited and vocal about the good things we are doing in the Valley. This is your mission should you choose to accept it. This message will self-destruct in 5...4...3...2...
