Jordan- A Thriving Student

Allow me to introduce you to Jordan. This past summer, I had the pleasure of being visited by him and his mom. Jordan is an ex-student of mine. We worked together during his late elementary school/early middle school years. He is now a thriving student at Riordon High School with a 3.57-grade point average.

When I first met Jordan, he was struggling with putting his thoughts into words. He also needed help with writing, reading comprehension, and vocabulary skills. He participated in both 1:1 speech and language therapy and creative writing classes at our center. He made incredible improvements during his time here, in part due to his determination and positive attitude. It was always a pleasure to work together, and it was sad when it was time to say goodbye.

I recently interviewed Jordan and discovered that he is a young man involved with many projects and clubs. These clubs include the DJ club, the newspaper club (Jordan interviews people and writes about them for his school newspaper), the Pilipino American Club and the Core Leadership Club.

We both reminisced about our time together when we worked on interviewing and writing skills. Jordan remarked that the work we did together on his writing skills is now helping him in both his world literature class as well as his work as a journalist. We also thought back to when we read about

Pilipino culture (Cora Cooks Pancit was a favorite book of his as he is a fan of Pilipino cuisine.). Jordan was always proud of his cultural heritage. It is a firm belief of mine that is important to expose children to literature that reflects their heritage so that they can experience books as mirrors of their own lives. This helps make reading a more meaningful experience for them

When I first met Jordan, he was quite shy, so I was delighted to see him now taking on a leadership role in the Core Leadership Club. He is enthusiastic about spreading the message to younger students that genuine faith is all about love.

In addition to his studies and clubs, Jordan does volunteer work as he has already grasped the importance of giving back at his young age. He works with young, disabled children, helping them to learn American Sign Language. He also does volunteer work at Laguna Honda hospital with the senior citizens and provides meals for the homeless. As if all of this wasn't enough to keep him busy, he is also holding down a part-time job.

It is a pleasure to maintain contact with this dignified young man and his family, see how well he is thriving in high school and hear about the subjects he is actively interested in including history and journalism. The Scottish Rite/ RiteCare Language Centers have long been pioneers in integrating working on speech, language, and literacy skills all at the same time. This approach helped Jordan become the outstanding student that he is today. The work we do at our centers, and the support of the Masonic community, allows kids like Jordan who need extra support to blossom fully. Jordan, his family, and I all thank you for your continued support.
